The series will be following individuals and their loved ones through one significant week with advice & support being offered during (a possibly challenging) 7 days. Each episode will follow 2 different stories, showcasing the ups and downs of those moments in a week.

Clients awaiting support

Art dinner

The next Art Dinner is to be held at the Princess Pavilion in partnership with Falmouth Art Gallery, Pavilion chefs and 3 local musicians (Alice Wall, Juliet Walshe and Steve Harris). It is "a multisensory journey into visual art: a dinner where each course is a 'taste-interpretation' of an artwork (that will be in the restaurant that night) from Falmouth Art Gallery collection, accompanied by selected pieces of music matching the artworks and food". There are limited places available so advanced booking is essential. Thursday 17th November4 courses £25.

Cheaper TV licences

Local residents who are blind or severely sight impaired, or live with someone who is, should make sure they aren't missing out on a 50 per cent TV Licence reduction. TV Licensing has been working with Cornish-based charity iSightCornwall to make sure anyone who is eligible to receive the concession is aware and takes advantage of the reduced fee. Increasing numbers of BBC shows are provided with audio description (AD), with over 20 per cent of BBC output now audio-described – above the target of 10 per cent set for broadcasters by Ofcom. A blind concession TV Licence costs £72.75 for colour and £24.50 for black and white.

Anyone affected by sight loss can get TV Licensing information by email or in Braille, large print or audio by calling 0300 555 0300. An audio podcast about the concession is available online at audioboo.com/tvlicensing

Excursions

The visit to the Flicka Foundation, the horse and donkey sanctuary at Mabe, was very successful (in spite of a problem with the taxi service) as was the first visit to the Hall for Cornwall on October 6th to see 'That's Entertainment'. The final excursion of the year, again to HfC (on November 3rd) is now full - although we have a waiting list available as there may be some 'dropouts' on the day. We are applying for funding for next year's excursions - suggestions as to where we might go are welcome.

Reminiscence project

We have had one of our funding applications to start a reminiscence project this autumn turned down but are waiting to hear if we are successful with a second one. If you are currently visiting, perhaps you would ask your elderly client if they would like to take part. We hope there will be more details very soon.

Co-op fundraising and help

We are confirmed as the preferred local charity for the Co-op stall in Boslowick. A membership scheme is now underway with a portion of spend donated to us – specifically for the reminiscence project (see above). So if you use the Co-Op (good wine selection) please sign up for a membership card. They raised over £400 from the scheme in the first three weeks, so the long-term prognosis is very good!

<u>Gas Safe</u> Cornwall Council has received another Gas Safe Charity Grant to help eligible homeowners to be Gas Safe. Who is eligible?

- Homeowners with a disability over the age of 18
- Home owners over the age of 60 in receipt of a means tested benefits such as the Guaranteed Pension Credit or Council Tax Support

Last year 60 households were helped with gas servicing and essential repairs so they could remain gas safe in their homes. The Home Solutions Team can arrange for a local Gas Safe contractor to carry out work at the homes of successful applicants. The type of work funded by Gas Safe are gas safety checks, gas servicing, gas boiler repairs or work on gas cookers, fires, pipework or water heaters.

<u>Falmouth Stroke Club</u> provides support, entertainment and outings for anyone who has had a stroke in our area.
