We have had a number of new referrals again this month and all have been matched. We now only have two people waiting for befrienders and two clients waiting to be assessed. We are actively supporting 68 elderly people through our befriending scheme and almost another 65 through clubs, classes and events.

The Potager and Sensory Trust continue to hold their activity mornings fortnightly for people living with dementia and their carers. The sessions run on Thursdays 10:30 – 12:30 and include time in the gardens, a dementia-friendly activity and refreshments.
