Clients being supported

We have had a number of new referrals again this month and happily have been able to match many of them already though we still have twelve clients on our waiting list.

We are finding that more and more of the people referred to us have complex needs and often fairly severe dementia. We are a *volunteer* service and do not expect to have to deal with very complex problems. The Falmouth and Penryn Repair Cafe

This is a monthly gathering where people can bring along broken household items and get help fixing them from people with repair skills - anything from sewing in new zips to fixing lawn mowers. The idea is to reduce the amount of waste ending up in landfill, develop people's repair skills and to reawaken the culture of repairing things rather than throwing them away and buying new. It runs on the 1st Sunday of every month (next on Sunday 3rd Dec) in the Methodist Church Hall, The Moor, Falmouth. It is a really friendly environment with tea, coffee and cake so if you have things that you want to fix but don't know how or have repair skills that you could share please come along.
