Queen's Award for Voluntary Service

Falmouth Age Concern has been nominated for the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service which is the highest award given to volunteer groups across the UK. Local assessment panels look at all the nominations and decide which ones to send to the National Award Committee. The committee makes recommendations to the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS), which sends a final list to the Queen for her approval. Winners are announced on 2 June in the London Gazette.

We have been shortlisted for the award and have received a presentation plaque from the Lord Lieutenant of Cornwall and a citation at a ceremony at County Hall so a HUGE thank you to all our volunteers, past and present, who made the nomination possible.

Need to borrow a wheelchair?

The British Red Cross are able to provide wheelchairs for a short period of time at no cost (although donations are greatly appreciated). This service is aimed at people who need a wheelchair for a couple of weeks or less, perhaps after an operation or to take a family member on holiday. Fund-raising

We could do with some more funds for the summer excursions this year – at present we have enough for three trips rather than our usual six or seven. If anyone has any ideas please give us a call.

Clients being supported

We continue to receive new referrals each month.

We currently have 64 clients who are being befriended regularly with a further 12 who are either telephoned or visited occasionally. There are only a couple on the waiting list at present but we do have some new referrals who will be assessed early in April.

Clubs and Classes

We held the first session of our new digital photography class last month. The second class will run soon, but the date is still to be confirmed. If you know anyone elderly who might be interested then please contact us for further details.

Unfortunately, we have had some feedback that the quality of the food at the last few Lunch Clubs hasn't been up to the usual high standard. We're hoping to hold a meeting with the Head Chef and Duty Manager at the Princess Pavilion to discuss some of the issues raised. In the meantime we've decided to change the venue for the April meeting to Rick Stein's Fish Restaurant, Discovery Quay. The Princess Pavilion will be closing shortly for refurbishment and so we will need an alternative location for the next Games Club.

<u>Walking</u>

We envisage a flexible arrangement between volunteer and client rather than a formal walking group. Travel to hospital

Age UK, with whom we work closely on a number of issues, is demanding the Government urgently reviews the way older people travel to and from hospital

- Our system for getting older people to hospital isn't fit-for-purpose
- Transporting older people to and from hospital costs the NHS and the Government millions of pounds a year
- Yet who gets help and how good that help is seems to be a postcode lottery
- Currently, many older people are experiencing anxiety, exhaustion and distress getting to their hospital appointments
- Every older person deserves to get to their hospital appointments safely without it being a struggle
- Hospital transport just isn't working for many of us

Age UK believe it isn't good enough and so have launched a national campaign demanding the Government urgently reviews the way older people travel to and from hospital.

They are asking us all to write to our MP demanding the Government urgently review hospital transport.
